The scammer told her that the massage was a reward for her loyalty. She was told to be on the lookout for texts pretending to be from her financial institution. Town & Country FCU staff say it's important to be skeptical. Credit unions in Maine and other financial institutions are getting reports from customers about texts asking them for login information. As we enter the holiday season, financial institutions often report a spike in fraudulent activity as people tend to make more purchases. Millions of Americans use dating sites, social networking sites, and chat rooms to meet people, but a large-scale prostitution and money laundering operation has been dismantled across Suffolk County and Queens, according to officials. Officials are reminding people to check the phone number, look at the link carefully, never share a two-factor authentication code, and to be cautious of any offers that seem too good to be true.
